

YOUNG COMPOSER AWARD 2010

International Society for Contemporary Music (ISCM) and the International Association of Music Information Centres (IAMIC)

ISCM / IAMIC Young Composer Award 2010 is awarded to an outstanding composer under 35 years of age whose work is being featured in the 2010 ISCM World New Music Days. The winning composer will receive a cash prize, and prepare a new work for performance at an international event in 2011. The new work will be promoted through the ISCM network, and through IAMIC – the International Association of Music Information Centres.

The Prize: commission for the University of Sydney and Professor Kim Walker, Dean and Principal, Sydney Conservatorium of Music, under the Vice-Regal patronage of the Governor of New South Wales, Her Excellency, Professor Marie Bashir, to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Sydney Conservatorium of Music.

The panel of Judges for the 2010 award consisted of Andreas Engström (Sweden), Stephen Lias (USA), Emilio Mendoza (Venezuela), Young-Eun Paik (Korea), and Peter Swinnen (Belgium). This year's festival included 43 eligible works, and the judges were present at the performances of all of these. They also had access to scores and recordings of the works for further study.

Having met on this, the eighth day of May, 2010, and carefully considered all eligible works in all categories, the judges are pleased to announce that the winner of the 2010 ISCM/IAMIC Young Composers Award is:
